### DOMINO'S PIZZA "Slice the Price" Fundraiser



The Knights of Columbus have worked out a special fundraising program with our local Domino's Pizza Shop. We will be selling "Slice the Price" pizza cards after Masses on the weekends of November 18/19, November 25/26 and December 2/3. The cards will be sold for \$10 each which entitles the holder to use the card as many times as desired — until June 30, 2018! Pay for these fundraising cards by cash or check.

When a card holder purchases one large-size pizza (14 inch) at regular price, that person will receive one large (or smaller) pizza for FREE. The \$10 card purchase does not go toward the purchase of your pizza. It is a donation. So, when you pay for one large-size pizza, you get the second pizza at no extra cost! The card can also be used for larger purchases. If you have a group you want to feed, for example, purchase 5 large (14 inch) pizzas, receive 5 additional pizzas at no cost to you. Buy 8 — get 8, at no extra cost, etc. If you need over 20 pizzas, please call the store to reserve 24 hours in advance.

The last day to purchase a card is December 3, and cards should be available for pick-up by December 16/17. So, look for the Knights before and after Masses this weekend — and the next two weekends. "Slice the Price" card activity will take place near the exits to the church building.

## PASTOR'S COLUMN

Time flies when you are having a good time," is a saying that many of us have heard, said and/or have agreed is true. As one who is blessed to spend at least one holy hour with Jesus in Eucharistic Adoration in our chapel most every day, I would testify that a holy hour often goes quickly and fruitfully when I am in the presence of Jesus in the Monstrance on the altar. Often I find myself just resting in the peace and love of the Lord.
