




PASTORS COLUMN

After the last few pastor's columns that dealt with our place as Catholics in the social order, including decisions we make at election time, I decided to turn to a subject that is pertinent to all believers...prayer. First of all, I want to encourage us to pray for our elected and appointed officials and the citizens of every state, especially through the patriotic rosary. We will be praying the patriotic rosary on Columbus Day (October 13) at 8:20 a.m., on the day before election day (Monday, November 4) right after the 9:00 a.m. Mass and Veterans Day (November 11) at 8:20. This unique rosary includes guotes from famous Americans about the connection between God and country and patriotic songs using verses that also speak of and/or to God (including the second verse of the star-spangled banner).

I also want to share with you in this pastor's column something I read in my "Padre Pio's Spiritual Direction" book, about which takes place in the presence of the Lord. My first thought was to share this quote with the parishioners who participate in the ministry of Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration. The Lord then encouraged me to share it with all of you in the hope that it might inspire more participation in Eucharistic Adoration, especially the commitment of at least one hour a week in the chapel with the Lord. Some, I know, wonder what they will "do" during an hour in the chapel. Such time can certainly be spent reading and reflecting on scripture passages, praying well known prayers like the rosary or the chaplet of divine mercy or reading spiritual works, and helps that can be found on a table in the chapel. One can spend some or all that time looking at the Lord with love and sometimes sincerely confessing faults and failures with confidence that he is looking back at us with compassion and mercy! Most of all, the Lord is gazing on us, whether we are looking directly at him or not, and his gaze is one of unconditional love! While we can bring to the Lord the cares and concerns of our world or of our country and "the" world (which can be many), we can rest assured that the Lord is ready to give us comfort and peace and help us let go of frustrations and even anger about things are not happening the way we wish or think they should and people whose words and actions go against (and sometimes strongly against) what we believe and do. Pleading to the Lord to give us more and more of his mind and heart, can ultimately lead to peace, especially after praying, and include the serenity prayer which says: "Lord grant me the SERENITY to accept the things I cannot change, COURAGE to change the things I can, and WISDOM to know the difference! I truly believe that those who give of themselves to be in the Lord's presence in our Eucharistic Chapel will realize soon that it is one of the cont.
