PASTORS COLUMN

I was visiting with a parishioner the other day and she shared with me that she has not filled out and turned in her 'Funeral Planning Form" in part because she wonders if she does so it might somehow hasten her death. She said she knows that is silly (or just an excuse) but she is one of many who choose not to make any plans for their funeral or place of interment while they are still alive. It is indeed harder for some than others to face the reality of our mortality. The Church gives us the last few weeks of the Church year and the first week of the new Church year (the 1st Sunday of Advent) to speak to all of us of the end of time (or perhaps of our time here on this earth) when the glorified Christ Jesus will come.

Trusting always in God's mercy, we nevertheless are called to be ever attentive and ready for His coming. This of course, means doing His work as his disciples daily, of spending time with the Lord in public worship and private prayer and living each day in joyful hope of his coming.

It is the best time of the year for me to promote EVERY-ONE taking the time to think about our transition from this life to eternal life with the Lord, and make decisions that speak of our faith, hope in and love for the Lord in what we want after we take our last breath in this world. While it is truly a blessing in more ways than one for a person to make such decisions (and the more details we choose the better), I encourage everyone to at least make it clear in writing what you want your family to do after you have died starting with the funeral home you want them to use. There are two funeral homes nearby (Carruth) or in the Village (CedarVale) and good ones in Hot Springs and Benton. It doesn't hurt to find out what services they provide and the cost of those services. The costs do, in fact vary, and may need to be of consideration when making a decision of who will care for your mortal remains and what is done before the funeral takes place. In our times, and especially given the uniqueness of many of our parishioners living far from family, one needs to decide if you want your body intact for the funeral and burial or if cremation is chosen, whether to have the funeral first with the body present (which the Church urges, but does not require us to do) and whether we will be interred in a cemetery or if we have chosen cremation, in a cemetery or columbarium. We now have our 5th columbarium in place and plenty of niches available for purchase (call Gary Wolfer at 501 204-1192).

I would hope that you would also take time to make decisions about scripture, songs and who you wish to be involved in your funeral Mass (and whether you wish for a rosary to be prayed for the happy repose of your soul either the before or the day of your funeral before the Mass of Resurrection begins). continued PLEASE, if you haven't done it, get a funeral planning form from the credenza in the hallway leading to the administration wing of our building or from Gina in the office and fill out some or all of it and return it to the office so we can make a copy or copies and keep at least one copy on file here. I am available to meet with anyone who wants to answer questions or help in any way as you address this issue in anticipation of "The End" which ushers in the beginning of your new life that will never end thanks to Jesus Christ and our faith in him!

GIFT OF ADORATION

Eucharistic Adoration offers a sacred time of stillness. By spending time in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, it allows us to step away

from the noise and busyness of daily life. It provides an opportunity to lay burdens before God, pray for loved ones and seek guidance.
